

Use the circuit given below to solve for the numerical quantities requested. Show enough steps so that your work can be followed. Show at least two significant figures in all of your calculations.


- a) Find the equivalent resistance of this circuit with respect to terminals A and B.

- c) Find the equivalent resistance of this circuit with respect to terminals C and D.


Use the circuit given below to solve for the numerical quantities requested. Show enough steps so that your work can be followed. Show at least two significant figures in all of your calculations.

- a) Find the equivalent resistance of this circuit with respect to terminals A and B.
- b) Find the equivalent resistance of this circuit with respect to terminals A and C.
- c) Find the equivalent resistance of this circuit with respect to terminals C and D.



We begin by naming the nodes. This is not absolutely necessary, but it is useful. Using these, we can simplify using equivalent circuits. $(R_1 + R_2) || R_3 = 31.22 \{ \text{R} \} = R_{16}$ $(R_5 + R_7) || R_6 = 26.69 \{ \text{R} \} = R_{17}$ $R_8 + (R_9 || R_{14}) = 31.64 \{ \text{R} \} = R_{18}$ $R_{11} || R_{10} = 17.88 \{ \text{R} \} = R_{19}$ $R_{15} || R_{12} || R_{13} = 22.75 \{ \text{R} \} = R_{20}$ See next page

With these simplifications, we redraw.




From here, it appears
to be clear that
the resistance between
A and B, called RAB, is

- b) From the figure above, it is clear that the resistance between A and C, called RAC, is

 RAC = RIG = 31.22[52]
 - c) Also from that diagram, we can see that the resistance between C and D, called RcD, is $R_{CD} = R_{21} + R_{20} = \boxed{34.17[n]}$

Some students will see this all, more clearly, if we redraw the circuit one more time. So, if needed, we could draw: See next page
